

What is the Apprenticeship option?

The Developmental Services Worker
Apprenticeship option is an on-the-job
training program for employees in a DSW
career that don't have the DSW credential.
There are two components to the DSW
Apprenticeship Program, on the job training
and academic education. At Fanshawe, the
DSW Apprenticeship program offers 780
hours of academic curriculum through 20
courses offered on a part-time basis. Classes
are between 8am and 4pm and livestreamed to students across the province.
The academic curriculum embodies current
philosophy of support and practices in the
Developmental Services sector.
